If you aspire on a career in academia, it is essential to undertake a masters/PhD program, and a strong interest in pursuing research would be an asset.

If you have agreed to any of these sentiments, then this webinar is for you. Moreover, it will be ALL about you, and whether the postgraduate journey is for you. Postgraduate programs are immensely demanding, require some sacrifice and are at times fast-paced. While all undergraduates/honors are necessary for this milestone, you need to be sure that you are capable of undertaking another year, or more, of study. Research programs can take up to two years full-time and require passion, lots of self-discipline and self-motivation, so have you got those skills? In this webinar, I will share some of my experiences of my postgraduate journey AND share the recipe for a Nobel Prize.
