Course Information: To be eligible for Anatomy as a major in your second year, you must be registered for Human Life Sciences without Psychology. If you are not already enrolled in this program, you can still apply for Anatomy. If selected, you may then change your program to include Anatomy as a module. Third-year students will not be considered for second-year Anatomy modules. Admission to these modules is based exclusively on academic merit. This course is challenging and requires full commitment, dedication, and a strong work ethic. Practical sessions will take place on Tuesday afternoons (14:00–16:00) in-person at the Tygerberg campus, in the cadaver dissection halls. Students will be transported by bus to Tygerberg campus at 13:00 and returned to Stellenbosch campus, arriving at 17:00. Theoretical lectures will either be held in-person at the Stellenbosch campus or delivered asynchronously through narrated PowerPoint presentations online. Students must be vaccinated against the hepatitis virus.
