NATIONAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS



The National Research Foundation (NRF) is the main funder of postgraduate studies in South Africa. The NRF offers partial and full-cost scholarships to Honours, Master's, and Doctoral students. Please visit <https://www.nrf.ac.za> for more information.

GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The National Research Foundation invites all prospective 2027 postgraduate full-time students not in salaried employment (contractual or permanent) while studying, to apply for funding support. You should apply for this funding opportunity even if you are not sure if you are going to be offered admission to your chosen degree programme.

The NRF minimum academic requirement for postgraduate funding is 65%. Successful applicants will be funded at either Full Cost of Study (FCS) or Partial Cost of Study (PCS). The FCS funding will be awarded to South African citizens and permanent residents only who are either financially needy (i.e., those with a combined household family income of less than or equal to R350 000 per annum), living with a disability or who are exceptional academic achievers. The PCS funding will be awarded to 5% of international students, including South African citizens and permanent residents who could not be funded under FCS but meet other minimum requirements for the NRF scholarship funding criteria.

DAAD-NRF

All fields are funded as per the NRF Postgraduate Scholarship Framework. Applicants must be SA citizens or permanent residents. The programme targets candidates who are working towards a Master's or Doctoral degree and who will be registered for full-time degree studies.

NRF-MINDS

Applicants must be nationals of an African country and reside in any African country other than South Africa. SA citizens are not eligible. The priority research fields are Water-Energy-Food Nexus; Smart Economy; African Heritage (People, Spaces and Settlements); Information and Communication Technologies; Artificial Intelligence and Robotics; and Health and Well-being.

Applicants must produce evidence of demonstrated leadership abilities or potential related to the priority research fields.

Honours Scholarships

South African citizens and permanent residents, AND citizens of Botswana, Ghana, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia and Zambia. BSc Honours in Astronomy/Astrophysics or Computer Science with Mathematics/Applied Mathematics. A minimum of 65% for the major subjects in the final year of undergraduate studies.

Master's Scholarships

South African citizens and permanent residents, AND citizens of Botswana, Ghana, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia and Zambia. Studies must be relevant to the scientific and technical goals of the SKA and MeerKAT radio telescopes. A minimum of 65% at Honours (or equivalent qualification) level. Students must have selected a research project that has been approved by SARAO for Master's research in 2026; AND have received written support from the relevant supervisor of the pre-approved research project.

Doctoral Scholarships

South African citizens and permanent residents, AND citizens of Botswana, Ghana, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia and Zambia. Studies must be relevant to the scientific and technical goals of the SKA and MeerKAT radio telescopes. A minimum of 65% for Masters studies. Students must have selected a research project that has been approved by SARAO for Doctoral research in 2026; AND have received written support from the relevant supervisor of the pre-approved research project.

- Official and certified South African Identity Document (ID) for SA citizens or Passport and official proof of Permanent Residency for international students.
- Official, certified university degree certificates.
- Official and certified transcript(s) of full academic record indicating the minimum required academic achievement in the previous degree.
- Recommendation letter by Supervisor (compulsory for Masters and Doctoral applicants)
- Reference letters and Admission letter indicating full-time registration (if available) - required if application is successful.

HB & MJ THOM SCHOLARSHIPS

The HB & MJ Thom Scholarship programme is designed to recognise and reward outstanding post-matric leadership in various fields such as sports, culture, academics, religion, and more. The scholarship is open to students who have completed an undergraduate qualification and now would like to proceed to complete a postgraduate qualification at SU.

While a good academic record is not mandatory for eligibility, the University prefers applicants who have excelled in their previous academic pursuits. In addition to meeting the stipulated criteria, candidates must also submit two testimonials and a comprehensive CV along with their completed application form.

To qualify for the scholarship, applicants must demonstrate exceptional achievements in at least two of the following categories: participation in SU student leadership structures, engagement in sports, involvement in cultural activities or community service, or leadership roles in religious organizations. The applicant must provide specific examples of their leadership accomplishments, highlighting three exceptional achievements in these areas.

The scholarship committee will evaluate the applications and select the most deserving candidates based on their leadership abilities, academic achievements, and overall potential to make a positive impact in their chosen field.

Scholarship recipients will receive financial assistance towards their tuition and living expenses.

Qualifying Criteria

- South African citizens only
- Full-time Honours, Master's, and Doctoral studies
- All fields of study are considered

HARRY CROSSLEY FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Harry Crossley Foundation is a private funding organisation operating in Cape Town, with their main focus being on tertiary education and research.

Qualifying Criteria

The **Harry Crossley Scholarship Programme** at Stellenbosch University is a prestigious scholarship that provides financial assistance to exceptional students who demonstrate academic excellence (an average of 70% or higher in previous degree studies).

The Harry Crossley Scholarship Programme covers tuition fees, accommodation, and living expenses. In addition to financial support, recipients of the scholarship also benefit from a range of personal development opportunities.

To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must have completed their undergraduate studies with outstanding academic results. If your research component is less than 50% of the total credits for the degree programme, then you are not eligible.

All fields are funded (excluding Theology and Political Science).

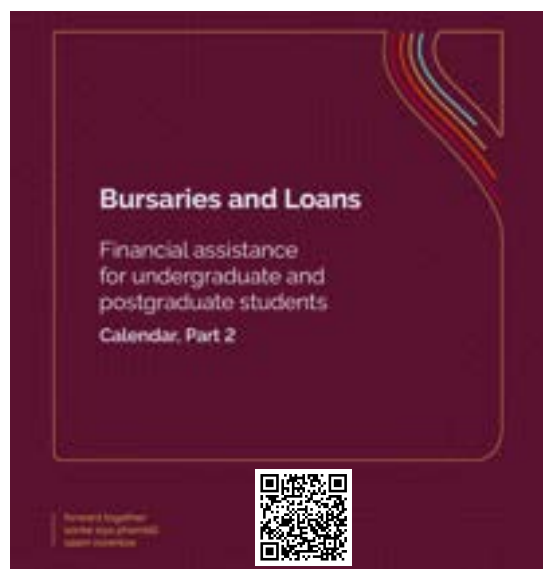

STELLENBOSCH UNIVERSITY POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME (PSP)

The Stellenbosch University Postgraduate Scholarship Programme is designed as a collaborative initiative to support, foster and strengthen our postgraduate talent, enhance student access and promote research excellence. This programme offers various scholarships to postgraduate students across all faculties, including Honours, Master's, and Doctoral degrees. The scholarships are awarded based on academic merit, financial need, or both. The values of the scholarships vary depending on the availability of funding, with some offering partial funding and others offering full funding. The application process is open from August to October each year, and successful applicants are notified from December to March.

Qualifying Criteria

- Each faculty determines its academic requirement(s); typically a minimum of 65% average in your previous degree (or your major) is required.
- Students must intend to register for full-time studies (no part-time programmes are supported unless stated otherwise).
- Honours, Master's and Doctoral degrees are supported (excluding postgraduate diplomas, certificates or advanced bachelor's degrees).
- Applicants may not be employed for more than 20 hours per week.
- Focus on further developing research excellence at our institution.

Scholarship Values

- Scholarships vary depending on the availability of funding.
- Partial and full scholarships are available based on academic performance/financial need.
